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**DECLARATION OF JAMES V. BASHIAN IN SUPPORT OF PLAINTIFFS'  
MOTION FOR AN AWARD OF ATTORNEY'S FEES, REIMBURSEMENT OF  
EXPENSES, AND PAYMENT OF INCENTIVE AWARDS TO CLASS  
REPRESENTATIVES**

I, JAMES V. BASHIAN, declare as follows:


1. I am a shareholder of the Law Offices of James V. Bashian, P.C. I submit this declaration in support of Plaintiffs' motion for an award of attorneys' fees, reimbursement of expenses and payment of incentive awards to the class representatives in connection with services rendered in prosecuting this action. I have personal knowledge of the matters set forth in this declaration, and, if called as a witness, could and would testify competently thereto.
2. My firm has acted as counsel for Plaintiffs in this litigation entirely on a contingency fee basis. The background and experience of the Law Offices of James V. Bashian, P.C. and its attorneys are summarized in the curriculum vitae attached hereto as Exhibit 1.
3. During the litigation my firm was involved early on in the litigation as plaintiff's local counsel. I participated in, among other others, the following activities: preparation and

filing of the initial pleadings including assisting in the related factual and legal investigations relating to plaintiff's claims; the preparation and filing of subsequent amended pleadings; briefing in opposition to defendant's motions to dismiss the complaint; participation in the various discovery proceedings including attendance on behalf of plaintiffs at the initial discovery hearing before the court; and participation in plaintiff's litigation strategy in connection with the filing and prosecution of this matter. In addition, I prepared and filed various motions in connection with the pro hac vice admission of out of state plaintiffs' counsel.

4. Attached hereto as Exhibit 2 is a summary lodestar report (including timekeeper, position, rates, and hours) for this matter. The lodestar calculation is a detailed summary indicating the amount of time spent by each attorney and professional support staff at my firm who was involved in the litigation and the lodestar calculation based on my firm's current hourly billing rates. The schedule was prepared from contemporaneous time records regularly prepared and maintained by my firm, which are available at the request of the Court. The total number of hours expended by my firm from inception through this date is 117.05 hours. The total lodestar for my firm is 76,082.50.

5. Exhibit 3 attached hereto is a summary by category of the unreimbursed expenses incurred by my firm connection with the prosecution of this litigation. The expenses incurred in this action are reflected on my firm's books and records, which are prepared from invoices, receipts, credit card bills, cancelled checks and wire transfer notices expense vouchers, check records, and other source materials and represent an accurate recordation of the expenses incurred. As detailed in Exhibit 3, my firm has incurred a total of \$75.00 in unreimbursed expenses in this litigation.
